

LENAWEE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS
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RESOLUTION - 911 EMERGENCY TELEPHONE SYSTEM
AMENDMENT TO FINAL PLAN

WHEREAS on January 14, 1987, the Lenawee County Board of Commissioners, established an emergency District as provided by P.A. 32 of the Public Acts of 1986, which encompassed all of Lenawee County, and

WHEREAS on January 14, 1987, the Lenawee County Board of Commissioners adopted a final 9-1-1 Emergency Telephone Service Plan which designated the Lenawee Sheriff's Office as the Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP) for the Emergency Telephone District, which was to utilize Automatic Number Identification (ANI) and Automatic Location Identification (ANL) as well as telecommunication equipment for the deaf and hearing impaired in the entire district, using the Direct Dispatch method of dispatching, and

WHEREAS the ultimate goal of the Service Plan was to provide a County-wide universal telephone number for easy access to emergency services by all County residents including a billing and collection service to assess charges to all service users of each service supplier, and

WHEREAS a consolidated central dispatch system exists as defined by Section 102 of P.A. 29 of the Public Acts of 1994, and

WHEREAS the final plan was amended on February 28, 1995 to reflect the establishment of an Emergency Telephone District Board (ETDB) as well as a method of collecting and paying a portion of the operational charges of the 9-1-1 Emergency Telephone system via a 4% surcharge, and

WHEREAS the Federal Communications Commission has issued a wireless emergency services order that requires central dispatch answering centers (PSAP) to request deployment of 9-1-1 enhanced services from Commercial Mobile Services (CMRS) suppliers, which include cellular phone service companies, and


WHEREAS 1999 P.A. 78 requires Plans to implement the wireless emergency service Order and Act, in order to qualify the County for distributions from the CMSR emergency telephone fund administered by the Department of Treasury and also requires a county to distribute all funds received from CMRS emergency telephone fund to the primary safety answering point (PSAP) within the County.


THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Lenawee County Board of Commissioners hereby amends the 9-1-1 final service plan to reflect the readiness of Lenawee County via its Public Service Answering Point (PSAP) to accept wireless 9-1-1 emergency service calls and dispatch same as provided previously, and be it further resolved, that the plan shall be amended as follows:

PLAN AMENDMENT

1. All Commercial Mobile Radio Service (CMRS) providers are requested and directed to deploy 9-1-1 enhanced services as provided in the wireless emergency service order, FCC Docket No. 94-102, adopted June 12, 1996 with an effect date of October 1, 1996.
2. The Emergency Telephone District Board, as the governing body of the County's Service District, is authorized and directed to take any action necessary to implement the Order, the Emergency Telephone Service Enabling Act 1986
3. The Emergency Telephone District Board, is authorized and directed to cooperate with the Telephone, Telegraph, and Radio Emergency Telephone Service Committee or any other state, federal, or local body or official authorized to install, operate, modify and maintain universal emergency number services systems, whether land-line, cellular, wireless, digital or radio based.
4. The Emergency Telephone District Board, is authorized and directed to implement, receive and expand, consistent with all applicable laws, any operational surcharges, CMRS service charges, or any other funding provided under state or federal law, including but not limited to such fees authorized, imposed, and collected under the Act.
5. This Amendment's provisions are designed to modify, amend, supersede or replace any inconsistent provisions in the County's final 9-1-1 Service Plan, and to augment, supplement or add to such Plan provisions that are not in any way inconsistent.
6. A final hearing on this Plan Amendment was held on **WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 8, 2001** at **1:35 P.M.** with the required posting made under the Act.
